

Dr. Lucas Garibaldi is an accomplished professor and research scientist who leads the Institute of Natural Resources, Agroecology, and Rural Development (IRNAD - UNRN/CONICET). He earned his degree in Agronomical Engineering from the University of Buenos Aires (UBA), specializing in Ecology, before beginning his professional journey in San Carlos de Bariloche (Río Negro, Argentina). Dr. Garibaldi focuses on researching underexplored areas in agroecology, pollination, and nature's contributions to people. He collaborates with stakeholders, including political figures, producers, and consumers, to promote biodiversity, sustainable food production, and an enhanced quality of life through science-driven initiatives.

He has a prolific publication record of 194 articles in widely recognized scientific journals such as *Science*, *Nature*, *Ecology Letters*, *Proceedings of the Royal Society B*, *TREE*, and *PNAS*. His impactful contributions have earned him more than 20 awards, including the "Golden Bee Award" from the Republic of Slovenia for his dedication and achievements in raising awareness of pollinators, the "Incentive Award" from the Bunge y Born Foundation for his significant contributions to Ecology in 2019, and the "Houssay Award" for his outstanding contributions to Environmental Sciences and Technologies in 2017.

Dr. Garibaldi has worked as a coordinating lead author and scientific advisor for several international organizations, including FAO and IPBES. He coordinated a chapter in the 2016 Assessment Report on Pollinators, Pollination, and Food Production and the 2019 Global Assessment Report on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services. In 2022, he was appointed as co-chair of the Transformative Change Assessment (IPBES).
